## Palermo, 8th-12th November 2021

The Summer School *Multilingualism in schools: methods and strategies for teaching languages* offers the opportunity to attend workshops and seminars in the field of language and literature teaching in multilingual contexts, to observe cases of good practice in schools, as well as to study multilingualism in Palermo, by taking advantage of a unique opportunity: the promotion of a comparative, cross-national investigation of the main topic. Participants from seven partner universities have been invited to share their expertise and good practice on how to deal with problems arising from multicultural and multilingual environments.
